The Friends of The Australian Arid Lands Botanic Garden, Port Augusta Incorporated cordially invite you to attend the biennial conference of The Association of Friends of Botanic Gardens Inc. August 2012

Pre and post conference tours will be available (see p 3).

Conference proceedings and social activities are planned both at The Australian Arid Lands Botanic Garden (AALBG) established in Western Myall woodland with open saltbush plains and a fringe of Grey Mangroves along the shoreline of Spencer Gulf, and at the nearby Port Augusta Golf Club, the venue for the conference proceedings and dinner.

Invited speakers are respected professionals and practitioners in their areas of expertise. We have chosen to focus on the theme of Myalls (the Western Myall is the emblem of the AALBG and occurs in the Garden); Mangroves (Grey Mangroves grow along the shore of Spencer Gulf our Garden's eastern boundary;) and More, which will include discussion on Eucalypts, European Explorers, Birds of the Region, Goyder's Line, and Water Supply in South Australia (continuing the discussion of reduced water availability in southern Australia which was largely the focus of the Mildura Conference).

There will be time also for discussion on your role as Friends' volunteers in our various gardens and time will be set aside for brief presentations from other Friends' groups. During breaks and social functions there will be the opportunity to interact with other delegates and share experiences.

The AALBG is situated on the Stuart Highway at Port Augusta West, 1.5 km from the city centre.

Port Augusta is served by rail, bus and air services and has ample accommodation.

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Optional Tours

Friday 17th August. Highlights of the Southern Flinders Ranges. Hancock's Lookout, Wilmington, historic Melrose, the oldest town in the Flinders Ranges. Meet locals and hear about national parks and reserves. Then to Wirrabara Forest and nursery, an amazing old arboretum of trees and trial plantings from many parts of the world. This is the second oldest planted forest in the British Commonwealth! Lunch will feature local produce. Drive through the forest to spectacularPort Germein Gorge, visit Port Germein and local horticultural enterprises. Includes lunch. [morning & afternoon tea are at own expense]

Cost \$105 per person

Monday 20th August. Central Flinders Ranges. Pichi Richi Pass to Quorn, alongside the original Old Ghan Railway. Visit the Powell Gardens, which showcase local native plants, and a Quandong plantation, before crossing the Willochra Plain, visiting Kanyaka Ruins and the ghost towns of Gordon and Wilson. At Hawker visit the Jeff Morgan Panorama Gallery. Lunch at Hawker. Continue north along the Leigh Creek Road on the western side of the Ranges and then to Wilpena via the Moralana Scenic Drive with its spectacular views. A short stop at Wilpena, before returning to Hawker, Quorn and Port Augusta. Morning tea and lunch included. [afternoon tea at own expense] Cost \$105 per person

On both tours stops will be made at places with toilet facilities.

Friday 17th & Monday 20th August Top End Eco Cruise. Each 2 hour cruise is limited to 14 passengers. This spectacular cruise reaches the top of Spencer Gulf and passes the Australian Arid Lands Botanic Garden. Dolphins, sting rays, and birdlife are seen on most cruises. See where desert dunes meet the sea and have a close up look at mangroves. The Gulf is very calm in this region and the boat well appointed and comfortable. Highly recommended. Cost \$40.00, includes refreshments. The second and third cruise will operate only if the earlier cruises are fully booked.
